To all Pierce County AA groups and members:

As you know, the CSO Committee has been trying to resolve monetary issues and how that committee can better communicate with the groups and membership that we serve. Prior to August of 2008 we became increasingly aware of problems that needed to be addressed. To that end, on August 3 of 2008, the CSO Committee had a Group Inventory done. Our perception of that inventory was that we needed to better communicate with the groups and members that we serve and that we had financial issues to resolve. To that end, I have made myself available to attend all Represented District meetings when asked and to invite each individual member to attend the monthly CSO business meeting and asked for input via your CSO representative. Since January the committee has:

- A) Established a limit on CSO operating capital
- B) Established a disbursement policy for excess funds
- C) Made a decision to provide one free copy of Pierce's Progress to each group
- D) Lowered cost of selling price of Where and When scheduled to 25 cents (10 cents less than cost)
- E) Made needed office furniture upgrades
- F) Purchased a new office computer and operating system
- G) Hired additional office staff per group's request
- H Effectively lowered CSO operating capital by roughly \$17,000

What remains on the Agenda:

- A) In process of establishing a CSO handbook (similar to Area and District handbooks) starting with all business and motions over the last five years
- B) Establishing a Mission Statement
- C) Continuing to attend District meetings and requested
- D) Being open to any and all concerns about CSO operating

Any and all decisions made over the last calendar year have been thoroughly discussed and we continue to base our decisions on three criteria: The Traditions and Concepts, what the groups want, and what is prudent to keeping the CSO office open and functioning. As Always, the CSO Committee meeting is the first Sunday of each month at 6:30 p.m., unless otherwise rescheduled, and is open to any and all who wish to attend. 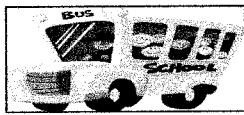

At the July GSR meeting the Area H & T chair came and gave a presentation. The P.A.I.R. group announced that they would no longer be meeting at the DSC because, thank God, they found a new home. They are now meeting at 104<sup>th</sup> and Canyon where Summit Higher Power meets. There was a motion to amend District Policy number 5 to read as follows: Action 29 Log will not print commercial and/or personal advertisements but will allow an events calendar on the last page of the newsletter to reflect are functions that are not related to service events. The motion passed with 13 in favor and 0 opposed. We also had our District Picnic in July. I was in Seaside, OR during the picnic but I heard it was a huge success.

At the August GSR meeting the Area Accessibilities chair came and gave a presentation. The DCM handed out copies of third legacy procedures for the GSR's to review because they will be electing a trustee at the assembly this year. The CSO motion was printed in the Action log and the GSRs were reminded that we would be voting on it in September. Having a district handbook was discussed. It was mentioned that it would be nice to have descriptions of the Trusted Servant positions as well as a record of passed and failed motions. The GSRs voted to establish an adhoc committee to look in the pros and cons of having a handbook. A motion (a copy of which I can provide upon request) was brought by Back to Basics group to make a separate event checking account for picnic and gratitude banquet so they would be self supporting. It was decided by the GSRs to consider this a housekeeping motion. The GSRs voted 8 yes and 8 no. Motion died due to a tie.

Phew! The above is a lot of information. That tells me that the Action District is doing a fabulous job as usual. Stay tuned next month for more reports on the hard work District 29 is doing to carry the message to the still suffering alcoholic. I am so grateful to be of service to my District and AA as a whole. Another meeting was added by the Treatment Committee at Western State Hospital on Tuesdays at 7:00. The Corrections Committee continues carrying literature and meetings into facilities. Our Archivist continues her work in gathering and organizing our historical records and we've been asked to host the Archives Quarterly on November 7th, so planning is underway.

The P.I./C.P.C Quarterly we hosted on August 8th came off smoothly, thanks to members from the following groups; Safe Haven, Unity Destiny, Follow-up, and Narrows. We had nearly 100% of our GSRs attend the Pre-Assembly on 8/9/09 (more if you count the Alternate GSRs that came to learn and provide support!) Several of the groups have already met to discuss the motions and gather their group's conscience.

Don't forget the Gratitude Banquet is on November 7th, 2009 at the South End Neighborhood Resource Center. Tickets should be available at the next district meeting, September, 15th. Our Area CPC Chairperson will be our guest. We won't meet again until after the Assembly in October. I look forward to seeing everyone there!

**Corrections Committee Article**

My name is Jim, and I'm an alcoholic. I was released from prison in August of 20008. When I got out, like many others, I was told that I had to go to two A.A. meetings a week. After about a month of only going to get my slip signed something inside of me started to change. I wasn't going to meetings just for D.O.C. but for myself. I noticed that I was going to two and three meetings a day. People around me started to see a difference in me that could only be explained as a spiritual awakening and I knew it was from the program working in me as I was working the program.

I went to my first business meeting and was voted in as the Corrections Rep. for the 12X12 in Tacoma. I wasn't sure what I could do--after all I was still on supervision and knew I couldn't get any clearance to go inside any facility to share what A.A. had done in my life. Soon after at one of our monthly corrections meeting at the C.S.O. the Volunteer Coordinator for "TROC" (Tacoma Resource and Opportunity Center) attended the meeting and explained how they wanted to start having meetings at their facility. It sounded to me like a door had just opened for me—and I came to find out that it had.

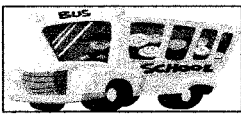
That was in February of 2009, and I have been the co-chair and Alternate Rep. for TROC since. In fact, I got married in May and was given a volunteer award from D.O.C. in June. Looking back on things I can honestly say that if it wasn't for A.A. I don't know where I would be or what I would be doing. Going to the 12X12 was the first step for me in a new life; one that I could have never even dreamed of before A.A.

Being the Corrections Rep. for the 12X12 opened up a door I never knew about. So if there is anything I could say to help another A.A. member it would be, "Come to the C.S.O. on the second Thursday of the month at 6:30 pm and check out what goes on in corrections. Even if you don't think you will be allowed to do anything, because I learned that if it is meant to be, it will be!"

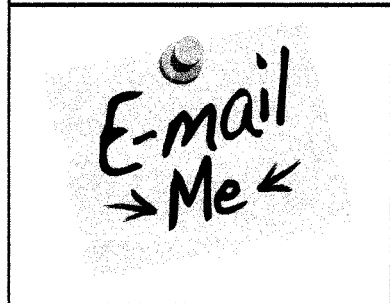
