Website chair is working on mapquest. Report for new schedules will be forwarded via the CSO liaisons to the GSR's for their districts for updates. Reports are due back to CSO manager by Oct 22nd.

Although group contributions to CSO are up, meeting contributions are down. Expenses are up. The Assistant Office Manager has reduced her hours from 12 per week to 10 per week.

The committee took the following actions to increase income. Effective September 14th, the price for the "Where and When" increased to \$.70. This is for the current inventory on hand ( approx 2500) and also for the next printing, later this year. Future pricing for schedules will be reviewed before each printing.

The following motion was passed: "Items purchased for resale from AAWS and The Grapevine will be priced to include current sales tax plus 5% for handling." This increases the price of all AA literature sold at CSO. This motion went into effect September 14th.

Grapevine/ Literature: Robert S. District Literature display will also be at the Gratitude Banquet.

PI: Scott A. They put ad in the Ranger Newspaper; September 18<sup>th</sup> they had a workshop on how to carry the message of AA to Non-Alcoholics.

Treatment: David D. Will be attending the Area 72 Treatment Qtrly Saturday, Oct 9th, in Kirkland. It will be hosted by District 38

At the last Pierce County Treatment Committee mtg in Sept, there was no Bridge the Gap report. The Treasury is ok, but there is not enough money in the account to meet the \$250.00 Prudent Reserve. Thus the Chairperson cannot be reimbursed for his travels to the Wash Area Qtrly last July.

**Corrections Committee Article**

My Name is Doug S. and I am an alcoholic. I had relapsed. I had not taken a drink or a drug in 22 years, 11 months and 2 weeks. I tried to stop again by myself for six months and could not last a day. I really could not stop. I began going to AA meetings. I was sure I would stop by going to meetings, but my drinking got much worse. This had worked before and kept me sober for a very long time, but this time I did not seem to have a choice—I kept drinking. I was very afraid I would die (alone). I was angry, lonely, and most of all afraid. I was in so much pain that I considered going to Western State Mental Hospital to be admitted because I thought I had gone insane. I was truly hopeless.

Finally I managed to stay sober for 60 days. I do not know how I was able to do this. I thought "I must not drink. I have to be sober to ask someone to be my sponsor". I was, of course, wrong about this. I would find out later I was wrong about just about everything. I finally asked a man to be my sponsor and he said he would be honored. We began to work in the Big Book and work the steps. He suggested I get a home group, go to business meetings, and a service position, like greet and make coffee. He reminded me often that this is a program of action and that I needed to stay busy, and I did what he suggested.

One Saturday morning during our work in his kitchen my sponsor told me there was a Pierce County AA Corrections Meeting coming up and invited me to go, so I met him at the CSO for the meeting. The fellowship at the meeting was really amazing, more AA members with dancing eyes and smiles on their faces, they laughed and joked around and then we got down to business. I noticed that there was one institution that required only ninety days sober to go to meetings inside, but someone had to sponsor me in.

Finally, when I reached ninety days sobriety my sponsor made a phone call and it was arranged that I would go to a meeting inside the Center for Forensic Services (the criminally insane). When we arrived I met Mike the AA GSR volunteer for the group at the security doors and he made me feel welcome and in we went to have a meeting of AA. I was surprised by the number of people there; patients and members from the AA community, 25 members in all, and we were really doing AA. There was a lot of sobriety in the room and I felt right at home. I knew right away I had found a way to be of service to others, and that I would not miss a meeting at the hospital if I could help it. My feet barely hit the floor that night as I walked out of that hospital, and over a year later it remains the same today.

I would relapse two more times and be put in time out from the hospital for the obligatory ninety days until I could rejoin the fellowship inside. Being kept out of the fellowship there is a huge motivator for me to stay sober. I am currently the AA Coordinator at Western State CFS for our Corrections Committee and the Corrections rep for my home group. I have over one year sobriety and take new members from the community to meetings inside. This is such a big charge for me to see new members get what I get there. I still don't miss a meeting there unless they are locked down. I am eternally grateful to the AA program and to my sponsor for the gift of service in Corrections.
